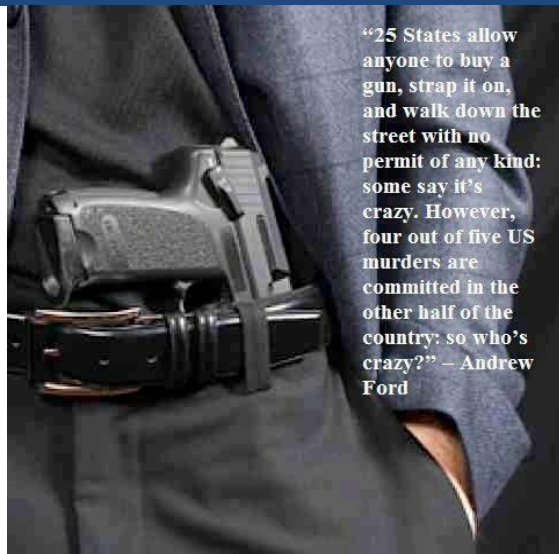


A Letter to Congress – By Rich Woldt CEO Risk Management Learning Center

I missed the listening sessions on gun violence in our society and active shooting incidents in our schools. I had to be in Arizona assessing risks to U.S. agriculture created by our failure to secure our borders or curb illegal immigration. They're enormous. Unfortunately, our attention has been focused away from violence on our border to a rehash of how stricter gun controls impact crime and violence in our society. History proved the more controls placed on a free society the higher are our crime rates and the more dangerous society becomes.

Our 25 States that allow citizens to strap on a gun without a permit are the safest. Four out of five murders in the US are committed in the other 25. Illinois, New York, and California have the strictest gun controls and are called "Murder Capitols of the World." Christopher Dorner is killing California citizens because they're "sitting ducks" unable to defend themselves. Federal gun controls have no place in a free society.

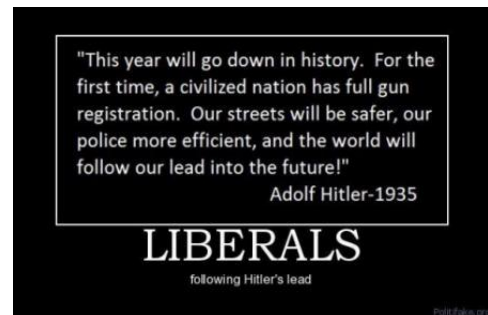

Wake up Congress! While we debate our right to bear arms, the Obama administration has been selling assault weapons to Mexican drug lords through Fast and Furious. Background Checks! The Good, Bad, and Useless!

Background checks triggered by the purchase of a firearm are expensive and seldom give more than a momentary impression of an applicant's state of mind or criminal history. At best they offer a dated personal profile that could change in a heartbeat, a turn in the economy, bump in a marriage, or love interest gone missing. True, a background check can uncover convictions but it says little about how many times a subject's been arrested, prosecuted, or jumped bail. They say nothing of expunged records let alone with whom they've lived or associated.

Background checks have a half-life less than the ammunition that comes with a gun purchase. They're expensive, a low priority for most overworked agents, rely too heavily on the training and experience of those doing the backgrounds, and last but not least they give a false sense of security to those who deserve better while exposing all concerned to enormous faithful performance and legal liability law suits. While background checks are a waste of time for some, they're also a duplication of efforts for many who've been checked and rechecked throughout their careers. For example, I've had background checks done by my employers, by InfraGard, when I qualified for my conceal carry permit both in Utah and Wisconsin, several times while in the military, and when I obtained my private investigator's license.

In each case the background check was conducted, not to obtain a momentary snapshot of my character and trustworthiness, but to establish a long term professional association with organizations who've continued a vested interest in my future. Consequently, every time I'm tempted to risk my reputation or do something stupid, I remember my PI license, my conceal carry permits, my military honor, and my career are on the line. Few people go through life without having a background check from time to time. Often, a background check in more detail than those proposed when purchasing a gun.

I recommend, rather than relying on costly background checks of limited value, we encourage gun owners to join and support already in place federal homeland security programs and projects such as our US Department of Justice, Bureau of Justice' Operation Cooperation ([click here](#)), our FBI's InfraGard project that reports suspicious persons and activity to federal authorities ([click here](#)). Let's promote membership in and credentialing of those who play an active role in our Homeland Security Public-to-Private Partnerships and professional security associations such as ASIS International ([click here](#)) as well as law abiding groups such as the NRA, Force, chartered rod and gun clubs, neighborhood watches, etc. Hitler's strategy was to "divide and concur," demonized those with guns then disarmed them before leading them to the slaughter. There are wolves and sheep in our society. We need more "sheepdogs" on our streets to protect and defend those on their way to be slaughtered. [Click here](#) to train yours.

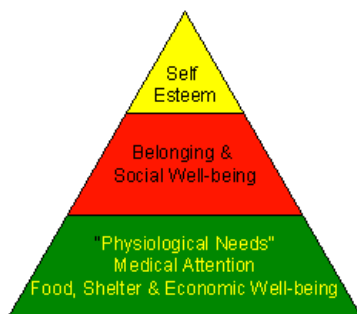

Veteran organizations (VFW, American Legion, AMVET posts, and Marine Corp Leagues, etc.) are failing because WWII, Korean and Vietnam War vets are dying and troops returning home fail to replenish our ranks. Veteran organizations should represent the best of our best homeland security assets fresh off the battle field and mission ready to rescue communities in harm’s way. Yet, we’re marching with antique WWII weapons, recruiting pall-bears from retirement homes, and forced to mobilize joint operations when raising funds or supporting our troops. Controlling school violence must be “bi-patrician” with everyone on board and willing to fund cost effective risk controls over the long haul. While strict gun controls might be politically expedient, they only raise the “security expectation” bar which in turn creates Lack of Faithful Performance and Security Liability risks. Restrictive gun control legislation in the U.S. that bans assault weapons or rounds a pathological nut-job brings to the scene haven't worked before and they'll not work now.

The facts are: Illinois, California, New York, and Washington D.C. have the strictest gun laws in the U.S. yet they're considered the "Murder Capitals of the World." **On the other hand,** Sweden's gun laws requiring each household to have a gun is credited for holding off Hitler's army and currently credited for ranking Sweden one of the safest countries in which to live, work, and raise a family.

He worked dead-end jobs, voiced fears of going nowhere, tried a well-trod escape route -- the Army -- but bailed out as the military downsized with the fall of communism. Like millions in his generation, he ended up back home as an adult, a man sleeping in a boy's room, headed exactly where he'd feared: nowhere.

For the most part, any aberrations in Tim McVeigh's life were hidden under an exterior so bland as to be nondescript. Many acquaintances had to struggle to think of something -- anything -- to relate about him. His interest in firearms was known only to friends who also liked them; a good friend from the track team never even knew McVeigh owned a BB gun. In retrospect, merely appearing regular seems to have been a lifelong pursuit.

"There's nothing alarming about him -- nothing," this person said. "He's respectful of his elders, he's polite. When he expresses political views, for most of what he says, Rush Limbaugh is scarier. That's what's incredibly frightening. If he is what he appears to be, there must be other people out there like him. You look at him and you think: This isn't the end of something; this is the beginning of something."

Psychologists have warned for years that young people like McVeigh born in the late 1960s, whose families fractured in record numbers, whose economic frustrations far exceed those of their parents, are unusually alienated and vulnerable to fringe movements. In this view, the social and economic upheavals of the last 20 years have planted a virus in American society with still unrealized capacity for damage.

Adam Lanza

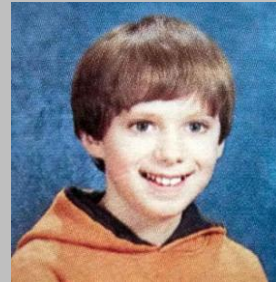
On December 14, 2012, Adam Lanza fatally shot twenty children and six adult staff members at [Sandy Hook Elementary School](#) in the village of [Sandy Hook](#) in [Newtown, Connecticut](#).^{[4][5]}

Before driving to the school, Lanza had shot and killed his mother, Nancy Lanza, at their Newtown home.^{[7][9][10]} As first responders arrived, Lanza committed [suicide](#) by shooting himself in the head.

The incident was the second deadliest [school shooting in United States history](#), after the 2007 [Virginia Tech massacre](#). It was also the second-deadliest [mass murder](#) at an American elementary school, after the 1927 [Bath School bombings](#) in Michigan.



James Eagan Holmes

James Eagan Holmes is the suspected perpetrator of a mass shooting that occurred on July 20, 2012 at a Century movie theater in Aurora, Colorado, which killed 12 people and injured 58 others. He had no known criminal record prior to the shooting

Jared Lee Loughner: born September 10, 1988)^[1] is an American who pleaded guilty to 19 charges of murder and attempted murder in connection with the shooting in Tucson, Arizona, on January 8, 2011, in which he shot and severely injured U.S. Representative Gabrielle Giffords, his target, and killed six people, including Chief U.S. District Court Judge John Roll, as well as a 9-year-old girl, Christina-Taylor Green.^{[2][3][4][5][6]} Loughner shot and injured 12 other people, and one man was injured while subduing him.^[7]

Acquaintances said that Loughner's personality had changed markedly in the years prior to the shooting, a period when he was also abusing alcohol and drugs. He had been suspended from [Pima Community College](#) in September 2010 because of his bizarre behavior and disruptions in classes and the library. After his arrest, two medical evaluations diagnosed him as [paranoid schizophrenic](#) and incompetent to stand trial. He was medicated while in jail as part of his treatment. He was again judged incompetent in May 2012. In August 2012, he was judged competent to stand trial, and at the hearing, he pled guilty to 19 counts. In November 2012, he was sentenced to life in prison without parole.



During the shooting in Tucson, Arizona, on January 8, 2011 at least one person in the store was carrying a gun. He told me he regrets knowing he'd just gone back into the store to get something but was toward the back of the store when the shooting started. Had he known he would have been able to approach the shooter from behind the stone pillars for cover and concealment.

Risk Management (RM) is a "method of management" that identifies, measures, and controls the risks we face each day. We all face two types of risk in life, "Pure" and "Speculative." When a pure risk occurs you only suffer losses while when you create a speculative risk you hope to make a gain but you could suffer a loss. Getting shot during an armed robbery is a "pure" risk while carrying a gun is speculative. [Click here](#) to protect political dignitaries.

Records of shooters in [US schools](#) date back to the [Pontiac's Rebellion school massacre](#) on July 26, 1764 when four [Lenape American Indians](#) entered a schoolhouse near what's now [Greencastle](#), Pennsylvania, shot and killed schoolmaster Enoch Brown, and nine or ten children (reports vary). Only three children survived ([Click here](#)). Active shooting incidents are no more frequent or severe in 2013 than they were centuries ago. It's just we're now all bombard by different angles of the same story, leading us to over kill one risk while creating others even more serious.



We're all responsible for our self defense. It's time we learn to profile those moving from character disorders to a potential threat to our schools. To the degree they pose a threat it's time we hold ourselves accountable for the tattoos, t-shirts and temperament we display to others. 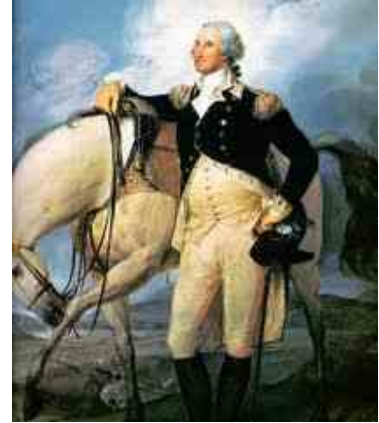
